REIDSVILLE—The Reidsville Police Department has initiated a city-wide and selective littering enforcement campaign in an effort to clean up local highways and city streets. Throughout the month of November, the department will focus on anti-littering laws and city ordinances. The purpose of the campaign is to increase awareness in regards to littering, illegal dumping, and related crimes; along with the associated laws and the social and environmental effects littering has on communities, lakes, and the economy.

The police department will join the Reidsville Appearance Commission and other community partners to educate the public on littering enforcement. Littering is illegal and if an officer observes an individual depositing waste material of any description onto public space, streets, highways, waterways, or any private property, the offender may be cited and fined up to \$2,000.

Reducing litter is a simple, three-step process: stop littering, pick up litter, and report if you find someone littering illegally. The Reidsville Police Department is requesting public support in the effort to make our community a clean and safer place.
